






Thoughts from the Superintendent

EVENT HIGHLIGHTS

In earlier days of the hobby, card-stock (paper), wood and metal kits were the

norm. The proliferation of inexpensive plastic kits pushed these other models to the back for decades. Jim Wanlass presented a hands-on clinic on how easy it is to build finished structures for your layout. One big advantage of card-stock kits is the adhesives used to build them. Basic wood and white glue work fine. There are no harmful solvents and no worries about sticking your fingers together. You may also be surprised at how little glue is needed on these models, how quickly the glue sets, and how strong they can be once dry. There are numerous websites that you can download and printout various types of structures in almost any scale. Some of these sights are free and some have a minimal dowload cost. 

I earned mine mostly by being a Railroading Merit Badge counselor for the Boy Scouts. In fact, I just passed off a few more boys in my neighborhood tonight! Once you've earned that certificate, you don't just stop serving, you just stop "counting the points" :-) Most of the people I know who have it, have probably "earned" it ten times over.

If you are not sure how you can serve, you can help with the Pizza Box Club by teaching the kids (and their parents) how to do model railroading. They are so full of excitement and energy, it's contagious!



What I like most about helping them is that you are assisting the parents to have a good time with their kids. They are bonding over an activity which just happens to be The Greatest Hobby of All Time! They can be making mountains, laying track, ballasting, painting, making trees and more, and by helping them to do so, we can enjoy the journey together!




