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
CLINIC SCHEDULE



Get "Spiked!" I Did! Guest article by Paul Dishman

To be completely honest, I only joined the National Model Railroad Association (NMRA) in order to conveniently (and discountedly) attend the Annual Conference and National Train Show that was held here in Salt Lake City this past July. However, once I was there and experienced the hospitality of the home layout tour hosts, the instant camaraderie with people from around the world, and the sharing of ideas among experienced hobbyists (and other stymied amateurs like myself), I realized the true value of the NMRA membership.



Among those benefits is our potential participation in the NMRA Achievement Program, which is a set of particular modeling accomplishments that can lead one to be awarded a Master of Model Railroading certificate. Although it is not directly related to any of the four categories in the Achievement Program, the Golden Spike Award is the NMRA's "entry level" recognition which serves two purposes. One, it acknowledges a modeler's dedication and accomplishments in important aspects of the hobby, such as building rolling stock, creating a setting of structures and scenery, and elementary "engineering." Two, the Golden Spike Award also provides hobbyists with a "soft" but leveraged entry into the more advanced Achievement Program if you choose to participate further.

As background, I have been building my free-lanced Aldey & Stillate Railroad (which runs from Hope Springs, Idaho to Pratt Falls, Utah) for almost 18 years. (Much of the rolling stock and structures are remnants of previous 4' x 8' manifestations that did not survive various relocation moves.) Once the kids were launched and on their own payroll, I negotiated a small bedroom which could serve as the A&SRR World Headquarters.

I had built the modular benchwork in my garage, so as not to make a sawdust mess in the house. It was dismantled and reinstalled in the bedroom which I had painted sky blue and had installed bright fluorescent lighting. The track was laid about 2004 and I could run a few trains with my DCC system. However, up until 2018 (due to life getting in the way), I had not done much more than acquire additional rolling stock and buildings, and use the rough plywood and Masonite backdrops to help me pretend what it was eventually going to look like. (In that regard, there is not much difference between a six-year-old and a sixty-year-old.) However, during the past two years, I have been able to dedicate more time to the layout and now have the scenery 91.32% completed. I still have lots of turnouts, buildings, and lights to power as well as some special projects that will get started in the next few weeks.

The Golden Spike Award requirements are fairly simple, and I'll wager that most hobbyists have already completed most of the criteria as I had. These requirements include displaying six units of rolling stock (scratch built, craftsman, or detailed commercial kits). (I had built, hand painted, and custom decaled many pieces of A&SRR rolling stock.) You need to construct a minimum of eight square feet of layout. (Thus, a 2' x 4' module can quality. My own layout is a two level 11' x 13' donut shaped pike.) You also need to construct three types of trackage (such as turnouts, crossings, or grade changes) and ballast the track. (Done.) Your layout needs to be wired so that two trains can be run simultaneously (all DCC layouts and modules would qualify), and then provide one additional electrical feature such as a powered turnout, building, or signal. (Mine was a turntable.)

I had created a table document that listed the specific Golden Spike Award requirements. (They are more fully described on the NMRA website). This helped me keep track of what I had done to accomplish each criterion. After reviewing the Golden Spike Award (and completing a few necessary projects that were still on my workbench), I invited Jim Wanlass, NMRA Northern Utah Division Superintendent, to come over and inspect my layout and its various accoutrements. I had set out the rolling stock that I had built. The completed structures, track, and wiring were already in place.

From the first glance, Jim was genuinely enthusiastic about the layout which salved my ego to no end. (When I asked if he wanted to run some trains, he lit up appropriately.) As he checked me off on the Golden Spike criteria, he pointed out that I had already accomplished several of the requirements for the AP areas of Master Builder – Cars, Master Builder – Scenery, and the Model Railroad Engineer – Civil award. Needless to say, these are all things I would have modeled or built anyway. Jim encouraged me to continue along those lines (pardon the pun). (And, with this article, I have serendipitously started on the Model Railroad Author award.) Now, I will push myself to complete at least few of the AP programs, if not attempt the Master of Model Railroading designation.

From this process, I gained a little more confidence in my modeling abilities. I received recognition for some of my work. I also launched myself into the NMRA Achievement Program. And, more importantly I made a talented new friend.

I encourage everyone to review the criteria, see what you have already accomplished, and apply for the Golden Spike Award. What could be better than displaying an award named for our own state's railroad heritage?

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2020 NMRA National Convention



on July 12, 2020, in St. Louis, Missouri. That being said, the local host group has determined that they can no longer continue with the preparations and operation of the convention. Among the reasons for this decision is the fact that one key member is ill with COVID-19. The host group requests your prayers for him.

Additionally, some members of the local model railroad community have withdrawn their model railroads from the tours based on their understandable and valid concerns about allowing persons in their homes who may have the COVID-19 virus. Even if the virus is well under control, that does not mean that everyone who attends the convention would be virus free.

Robert Amsler, Manager of the Meetings and Trade Show Department has advised the officers and the board of directors of this decision and the officers and directors fully support canceling the convention. Neither the Gateway 2020 crew nor the NMRA made this decision in haste or without careful consideration of all involved. The cancellation is in the best interest of the NMRA members, their family members, and the NMRA. It is noteworthy that the NMRA has never cancelled a convention before Gateway 2020 and that includes during World War II.

For those who have registered for the convention, the refund policy will be published as soon as possible at Gateway2020.org. We, the Gateway 2020 Committee, will need some time to make the necessary changes to the website to process the refunds.

Again, all involved regret this decision but we trust that you will understand the necessity and reasoning behind the decision.

New O Scale Narrow Guage Club Organizing


