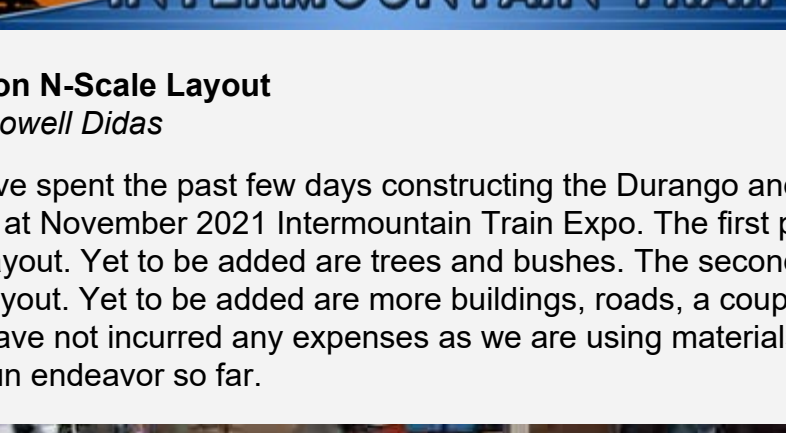


Layout Wiring

It's great being able to build a layout! The reward for putting in all that time and effort is the enjoyment of watching the trains run! After all, we are modeling a transportation industry. It would lose some of the excitement if we had to drag them around the track with a pull string. That is why clinics like Kevin Anderson's layout wiring become very important! In February's month clinic, Kevin gave us the basic tips and techniques for getting the trains moving. For the May's clinic, Kevin expanded on the base knowledge from the previous clinic and added the next step to get those trains running. He talked about the importance of boosters, how to add districts and sub-districts, the Loconet, and power buses to a DCC layout. The Northern Utah Division of the NMRA will be hosting its annual train show on Nov 5th, 6th, and 7th this year (Covid-19 permitting). We have acquired the Legacy Event Center, in Farmington, Buildings 1, 2, and 3 for a total of 22,695 square feet for layouts, vendors, exhibitors, and kid's activities. That works out to 47% of the space we had at Mountain America Expo Center, in Sandy, but at 35% of the cost (not to mention many of the things we had to pay extra for at Sandy are included in the price of the rent in Farmington).

We are asking you to put your volunteer spirit in high gear and step up to help us with one of the following committees:

- Facilities
- Layouts
- Vendors
- Marketing/Advertisement
- Hospitality
- Volunteer Coordinator

We need help in these areas today to get things organized and moving. We also need ideas to make the show even better even though it will be smaller. These jobs should not take more than an hour or two each week for now, but more as we get closer to the show dates. You are free to ask anyone you care to assist you fulfill the job responsibilities. Obviously when the days of the actual show arrives, we will need many to step forward to help make the show a success, such as set-up and take-down crew, ticket sellers, kid activity monitors, roving security, hospitality room host(ess), and etc.

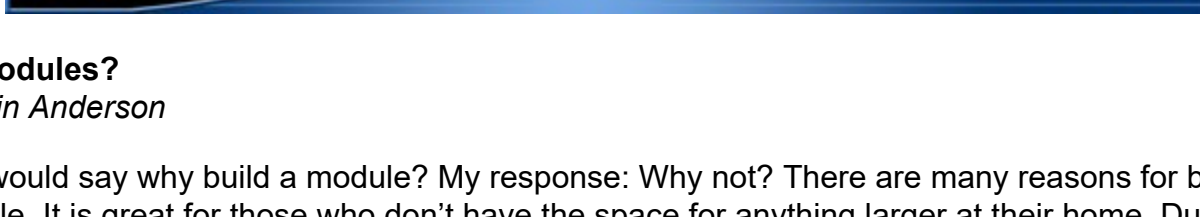
Call me today to join the team that will be putting on the premier kid-friendly train show of the Intermountain West.

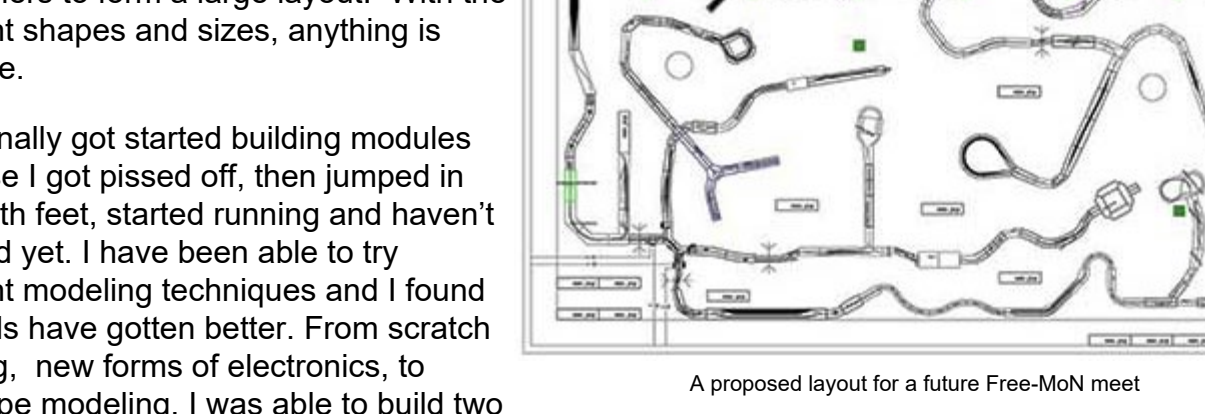

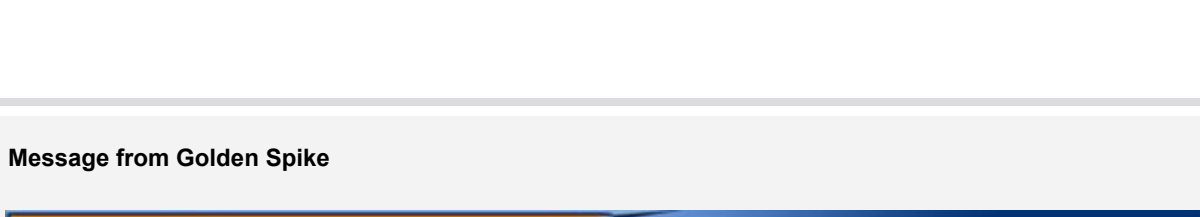

Why Modules?



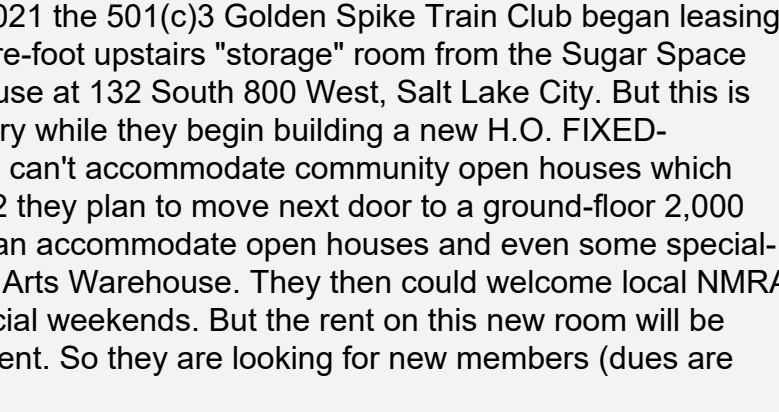
Why Modules?

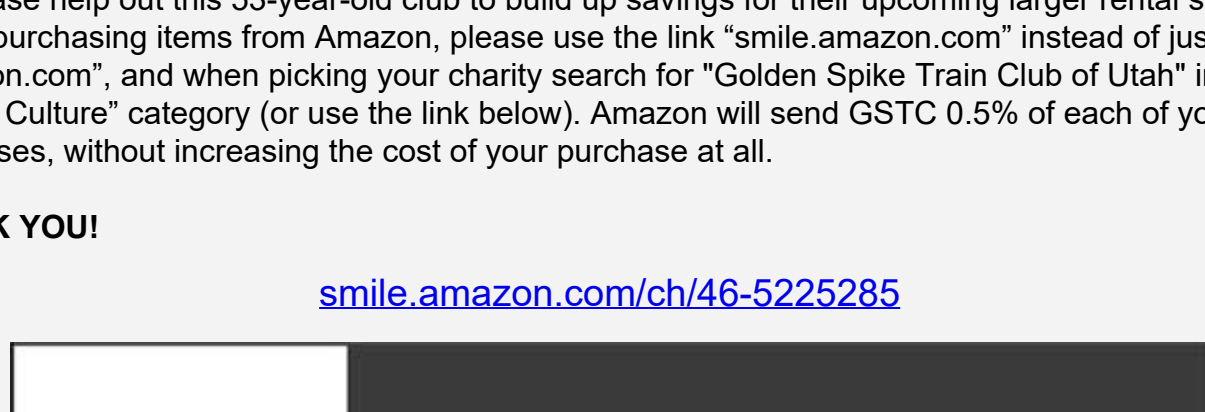
Some would say why build a module? My response: Why not? There are many reasons for building a module. It is great for those who don't have the space for anything larger at their home. Due to their compact size, storage is simple. They can be finished quickly unlike most home layouts that remain in construction mode for years at a time. New techniques can be tried out and perfected. They can be built for any scale. Follow a short list of standards, then build what you want. I went from building an HO layout in my home to N scale modules. Then there is the social aspect. I can now say that I have friends all over the country that I have met and

correspond with regularly that build modules. In fact they hold a zoom meeting twice a month. Then once you get together, the modules can be connected with others to form a large layout. With the different shapes and sizes, anything is possible.

I personally got started building modules because I got pissed off, then jumped in with both feet, started running and haven't stopped yet. I have been able to try different modeling techniques and I found my skills have gotten better. From scratch building, new forms of electronics, to prototype modeling. I was able to build two modules based in different eras. One in the mid to late 1800's and the other in 1944. Themes and models that I would never have been able to do without the flexibility of modules.

So if you have been contemplating building a module, give it a go. Modular model railroading is another fun aspect of the hobby. Just a word of caution, it can be addictive. I started in 2019 and I am already working on my ninth module.

A Special Message from Golden Spike

Due to the March 18, 2020 magnitude 5.7 earthquake near SLC, the Golden Spike Train Club of 35 members was forced by SLC Corp to evacuate their 33-year location at the Warm Springs Plunge (or old 1985 Children's Museum) building at 840 N 300 West. They had built Utah's largest static club-owned H.O. DCC layout, but they basically had to abandon it with very little hope of running it again for many years. The club went on a 8-month search for a new place they could afford.

In January 2021 the 501(c)3 Golden Spike Train Club began leasing an 800-square-foot upstairs "storage" room from the Sugar Space Arts Warehouse at 132 South 800 West, Salt Lake City. But this is only temporary while they begin building a new H.O. FIXED-MODULAR model railroad layout. This room can't accommodate community open houses which they were doing monthly. But by end of 2022 they plan to move next door to a ground-floor 2,000 square foot climate-controlled room which can accommodate open houses and even some special-event train shows at the same Sugar Space Arts Warehouse. They then could welcome local NMRA events with other clubs and vendors on special weekends. But the rent on this new room will be about 4 times the current lease-agreement rent. So they are looking for new members (dues are \$20/month).

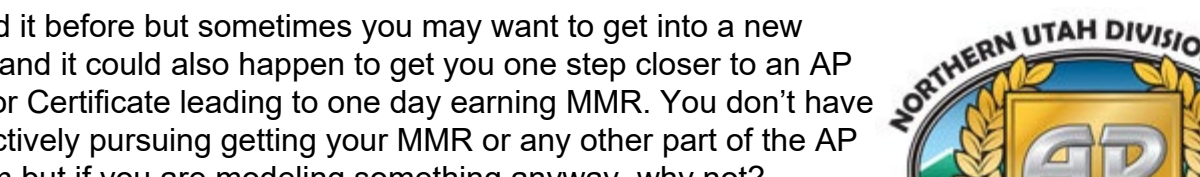

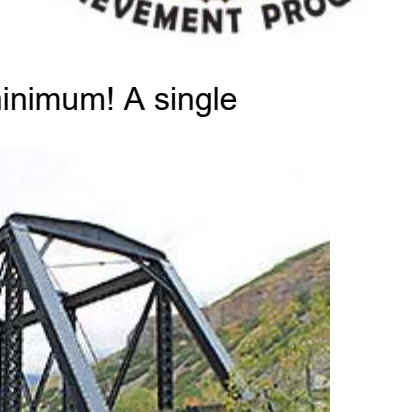

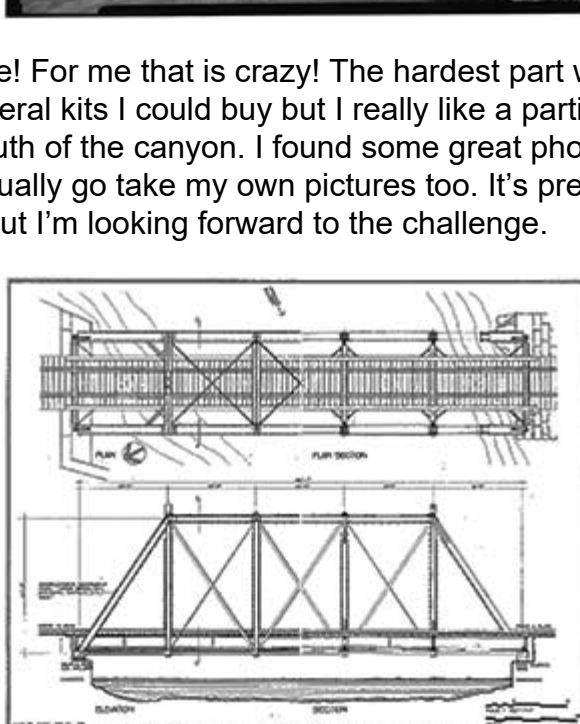
Achievement Program



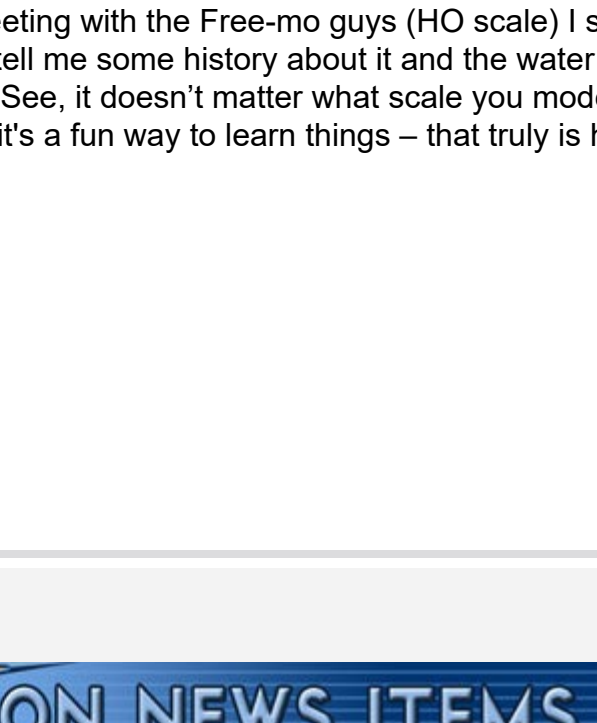
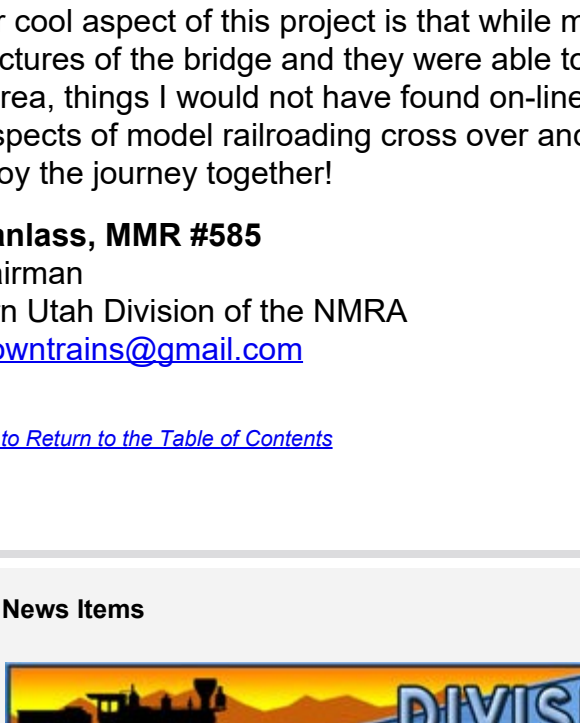
I've said it before but sometimes you may want to get into a new project and it could also happen to get you one step closer to an AP award or Certificate leading to one day earning MMR. You don't have to be actively pursuing getting your MMR or any other part of the AP program but if you are modeling something anyway, why not?



I've started a new project: a Free-moN module. One of the largest Free-moN meets in North America will be in Evanston in a couple months. I was just going to run trains but decided to do a small module. At first I was trying to see how much track I could fit in and go a little crazy like I normally do but decided to keep the crazy to a minimum! A single



mainline! For me that is crazy! The hardest part will be scratch-building an N scale bridge. There are several kits I could buy but I really like a particular photo of the bridge over the Provo River at the mouth of the canyon. I found some great photos and references on-line plus it's close enough I can actually go take my own pictures too. It's pretty unique (compared to the kits I've seen.) It will be tough but I'm looking forward to the challenge.



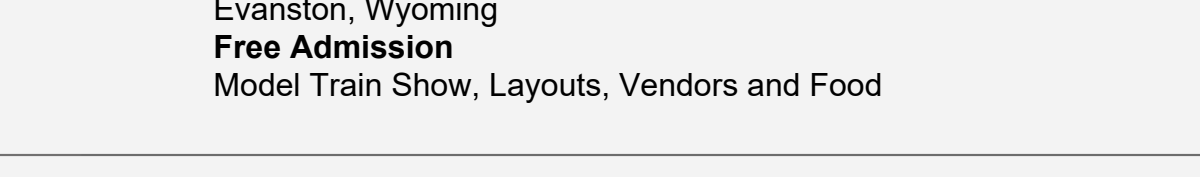
If I still needed my Structures Certificate, I could check off that requirement – one requirement is building a bridge (and some structures need to be scratch-built, but not all.) I still need my Scenery Certificate and if/when I get this module done I can earn some "square-feet needed" towards that. Think about your current project and how it might "earn some points" or pass off requirements for the AP. I was able to print to scale the actual drawing of the bridge I found on-line. I think that's pretty cool. I'd like to try 3D printing some parts, combined with brass rod and other styrene structure pieces. We will see. I've got a long way to go!

Another cool aspect of this project is that while meeting with the Free-mo guys (HO scale) I showed them pictures of the bridge and they were able to tell me some history about it and the water rights of the area, things I would not have found on-line! See, it doesn't matter what scale you model in – most aspects of model railroading cross over and it's a fun way to learn things – that truly is how we can enjoy the journey together!

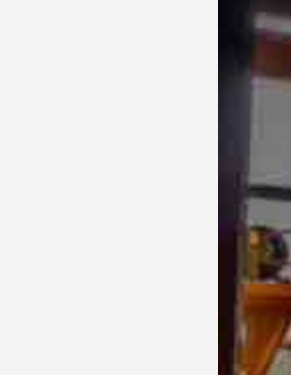

If you currently are, or recently have been, showing flu-like/covid like symptoms we ask that you please stay home, this is a monthly event.

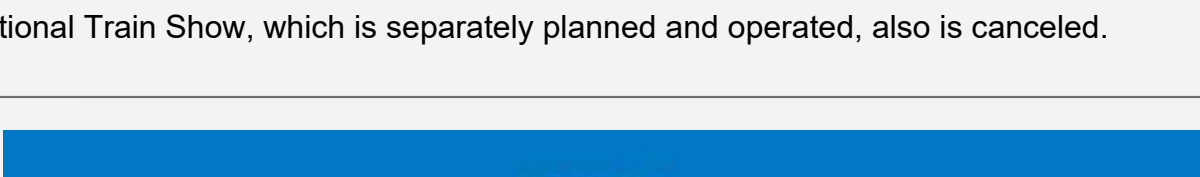
Due to eased Covid restrictions we are no longer using social distancing train cars. This means lines will be shorter and trains will be at full capacity! Masks are welcomed, but not required.

As you've heard, NMRA 2021 Rails By The Bay has transitioned to a video-rich, online virtual convention scheduled for five days from July 6-10, 2021. We'll be offering live online video clinics and panel programs, with real-time Q&A with speakers. All video will be offered using high-bandwidth, high-resolution, pro-level service from Zoom, supplemented by online chat via the Slack platform. We have clinic Frank Markovich MMR® will describe building parts of the "Magic of Scale Model Railroading" exhibit at the California State Railroad Museum. We'll also be offering pre-recorded video layout tours, coupled with live Q&A with layout owners. You'll virtually visit the top-quality layouts of modelers like Jack Burgess, Guy Cantwell, Dave Connery, Bill Decker, Dave Houston, Otis McGee, Dave Stanley, and more. We're also developing an online, photo-based model show so you can showcase the models you've built in the past year, with a "meet the modeler" panel so you can chat about techniques.
