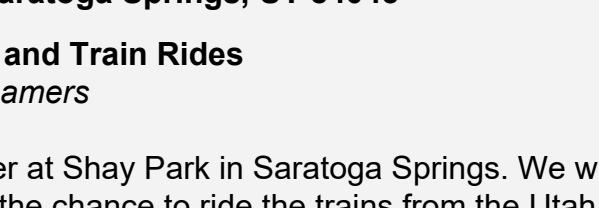
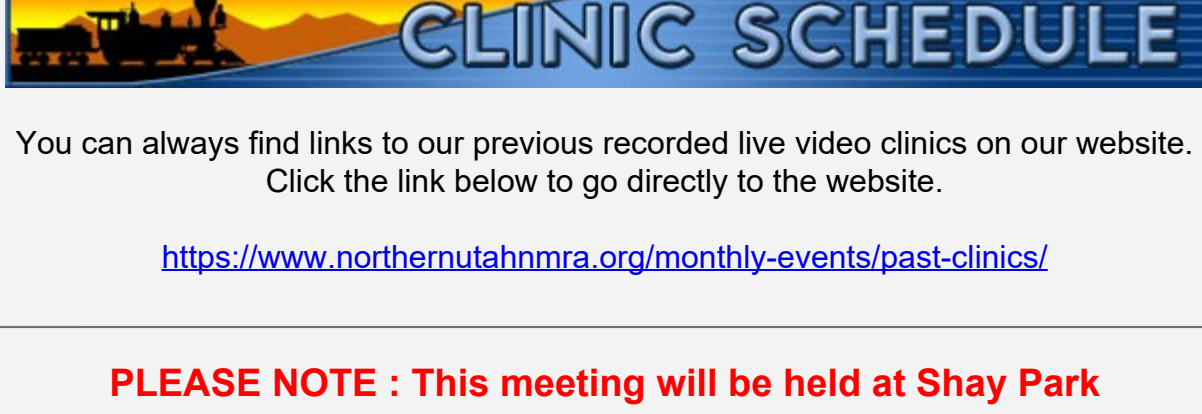

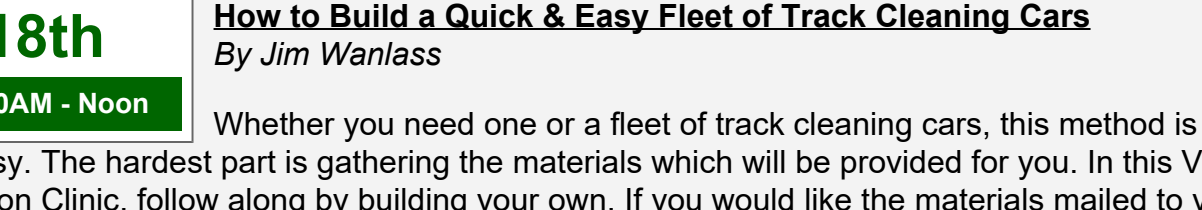
- Train rides will be from 8AM - 11AM.

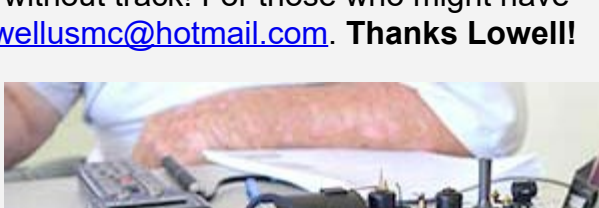
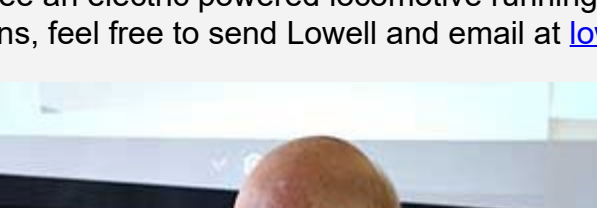
Thoughts from the Superintendent

Charging On30 locomotives on a Dead Track
Presented by Lowell Didas

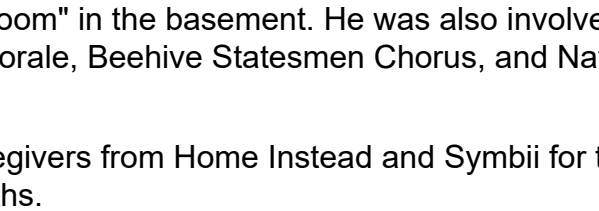
Our regional cat herder (Regional President), Lowell Didas treated us to an interesting presentation on "Dead Rail". For those who may not know, Dead Rail is the ability to run your engines without any direct power connection to the track. The track is literally dead. All power for the engine is achieved through an on-board battery hidden somewhere in the engine. The larger the engine the larger the battery and longer run time between charges. So how do you charge the battery? That was the key part of the presentation by Lowell. He has developed a way to use a small magnetic plug connection in the tender of his On30 locomotive. This way he can easily attach the charging cord without disassembling the locomotive to get to the battery. It was a very interesting clinic and fun to see an electric powered locomotive running without track! 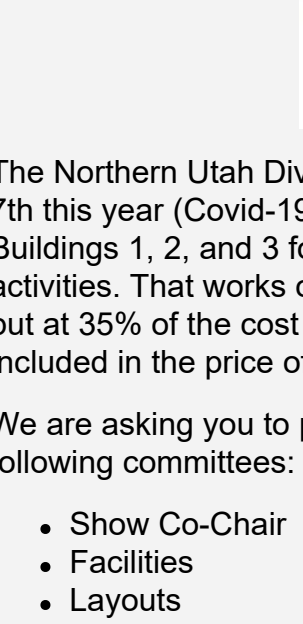
Dave brought a Kadee HO scale logging caboose he has been building. Nice job Dave!

Rex Dreyton Bailey passed away peacefully at his home in Lehi, Utah on Tuesday, June 15, 2021. He was born November 6, 1944 in Lincoln, Nebraska to Robert Dedan Bailey and Margaret Lucille Mead. Rex and his younger brother Eric moved from Nebraska to Colorado when Rex was around four years old.

Rex was married to Debra Ann Kyle (Debbie) on March 22, 1972 in the Manti Utah Temple. Rex and Debbie lived for a short time in Wheat Ridge, Colorado, before moving to Salt Lake City where Rex was employed as a programmer for a mining company. They relocated to Arvada, Colorado, seven years later when Rex took a job for Colorado National Bank. Eight years later, they moved to Kaysville, Utah, and Rex worked for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints for the next 11 years before retiring. They moved to West Valley City in 1997, then to Lehi in 2008, where they lived in an active-adult community for a while and then built their dream home in 2019.

While in college, Rex was baptized a member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints where he remained active until his death. He most recently served as a Sunday School teacher. 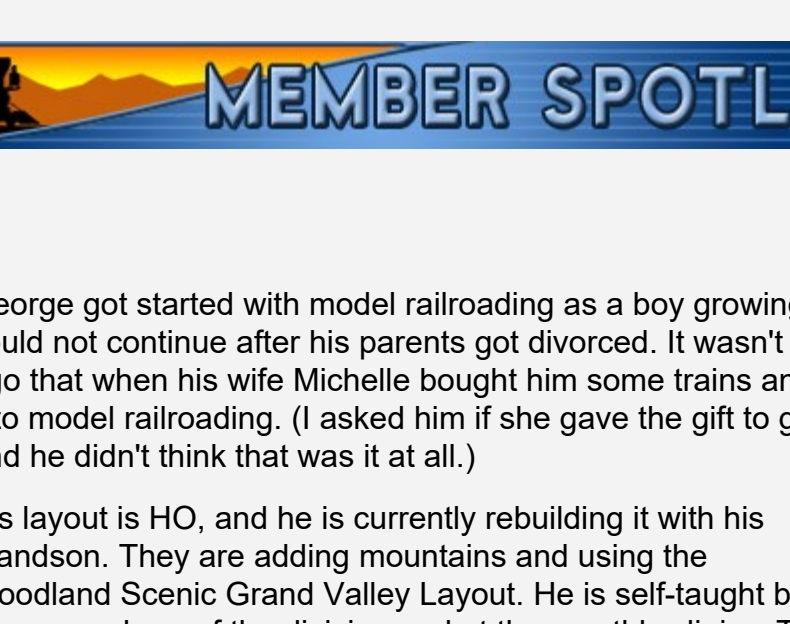
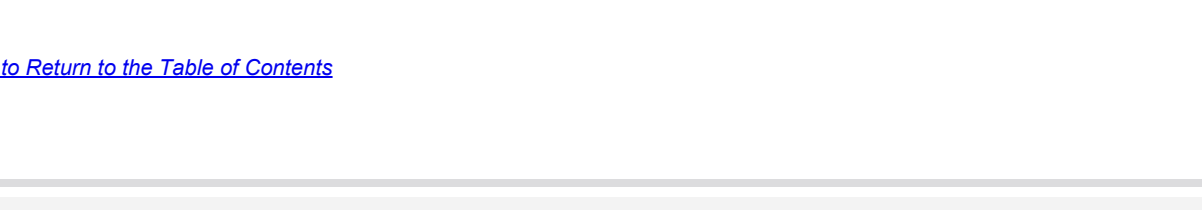

The Northern Utah Division of the NMRA will be hosting its annual train show on Nov 5th, 6th, and 7th this year (Covid-19 permitting). We have acquired the Legacy Event Center, in Farmington, Buildings 1, 2, and 3 for a total of 22,695 square feet for layouts, vendors, exhibitors, and kid's activities. That works out to 47% of the space we had at Mountain America Expo Center, in Sandy, but at 35% of the cost (not to mention many of the things we had to pay extra for at Sandy are included in the price of the rent in Farmington).

We are asking you to put your volunteer spirit in high gear and step up to help us with one of the following committees:

- Vendors
- Marketing/Advisement
- Hospitality
- Volunteer Coordinator

We need help in these areas today to get things organized and moving. We also need ideas to make the show even better even though it will be smaller. Salt Lake City, Utah

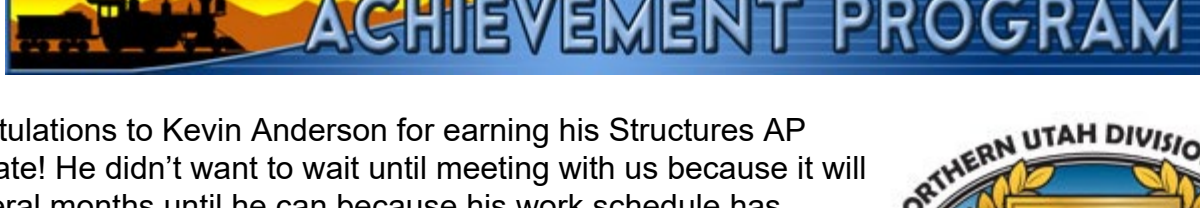

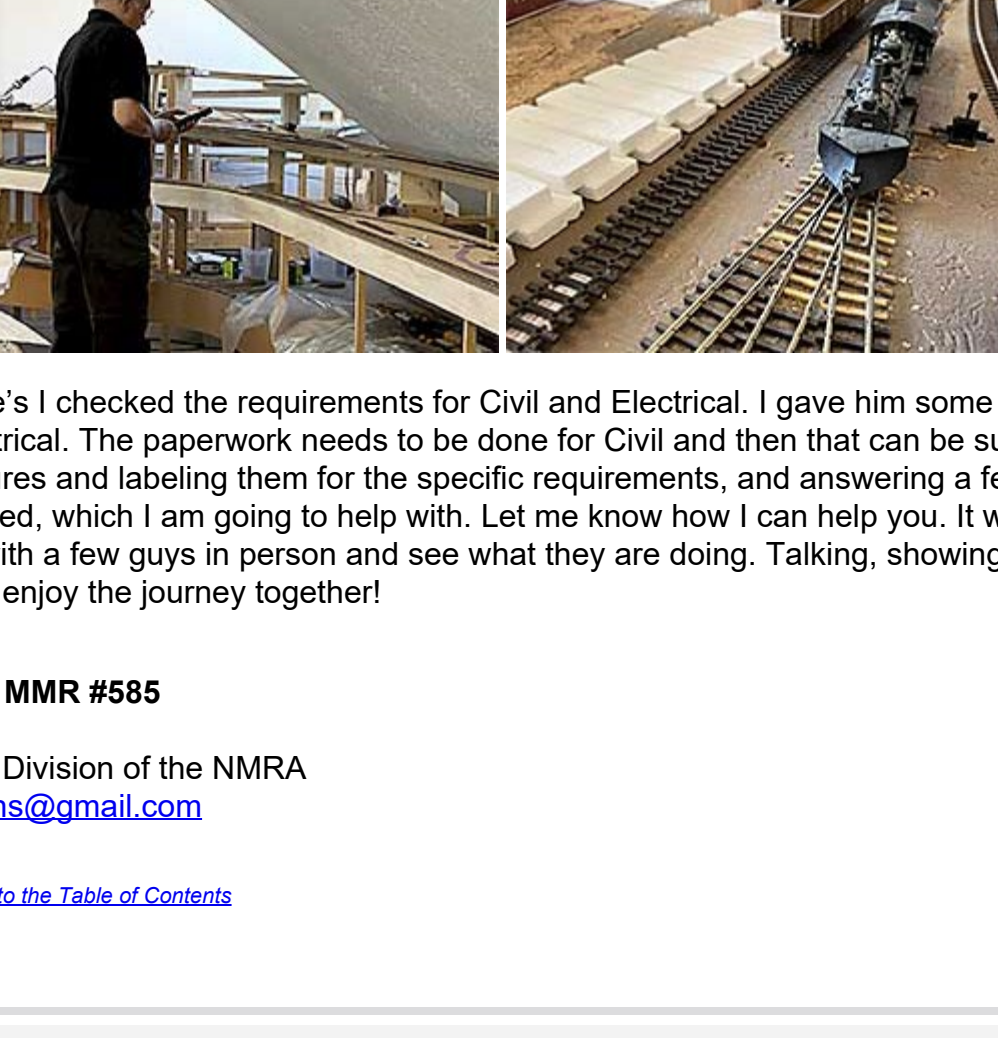
Achievement Program



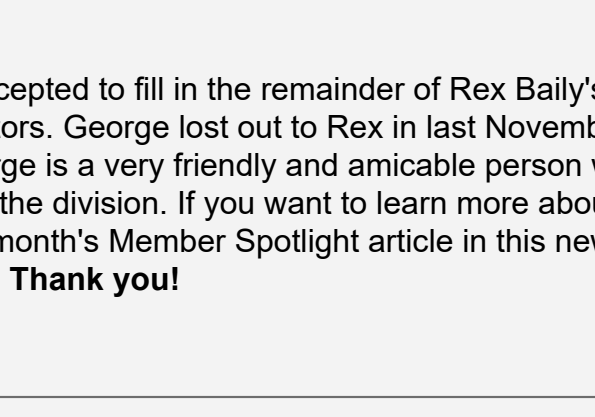
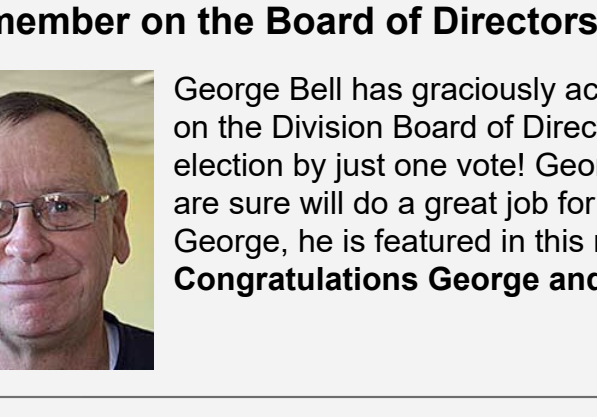

He didn't want to wait until meeting with us because it will be several months until he can because his work schedule has changed. I understand, at times I was impatient too. His overall patience has however paid off. It was quite a journey. I remember first evaluating some of his structures before the 2019 SLC National NMRA Convention! There were some that he reworked that were able to earn merit awards and others that he built in N scale that turned out pretty impressive. His home layout is HO but after attending the 2019 Convention he got bit by the Free-moN bug!



You can mix and match different scales while working on your AP. The Scenery Certificate is one of the ones I still don't have but plan on using my Free-mo module, my Free-moN module, part of my N scale layout and another HO module to qualify for it! Keven already has the Scenery Certificate but by having it on display at an NMRA event he can earn points towards earning his Volunteer Certificate. He can also do an article on working in a new scale and what that is like and/or his experience in Free-moN versus a home layout (two different articles) and those can earn him points towards his Author Certificate.

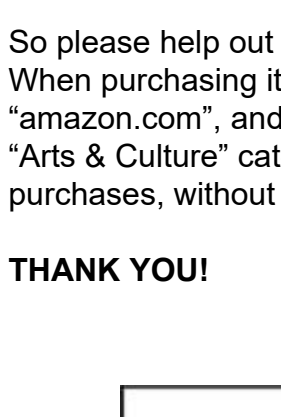
Nut-Lug Train Show in Ely, Nevada

A Special Message from Golden Spike



Due to the March 18, 2020 magnitude 5.7 earthquake near SLC, the Golden Spike Train Club of 35 members was forced by SLC Corp to evacuate their 33-year location at the Warm Springs Plunge (or old 1985 Children's Museum) building at 840 N 300 West. They had built Utah's largest static club-owned H.O. DCC layout, but they basically had to abandon it with very little hope of running it again for many years. The club went on a 8-month search for a new place they could afford.

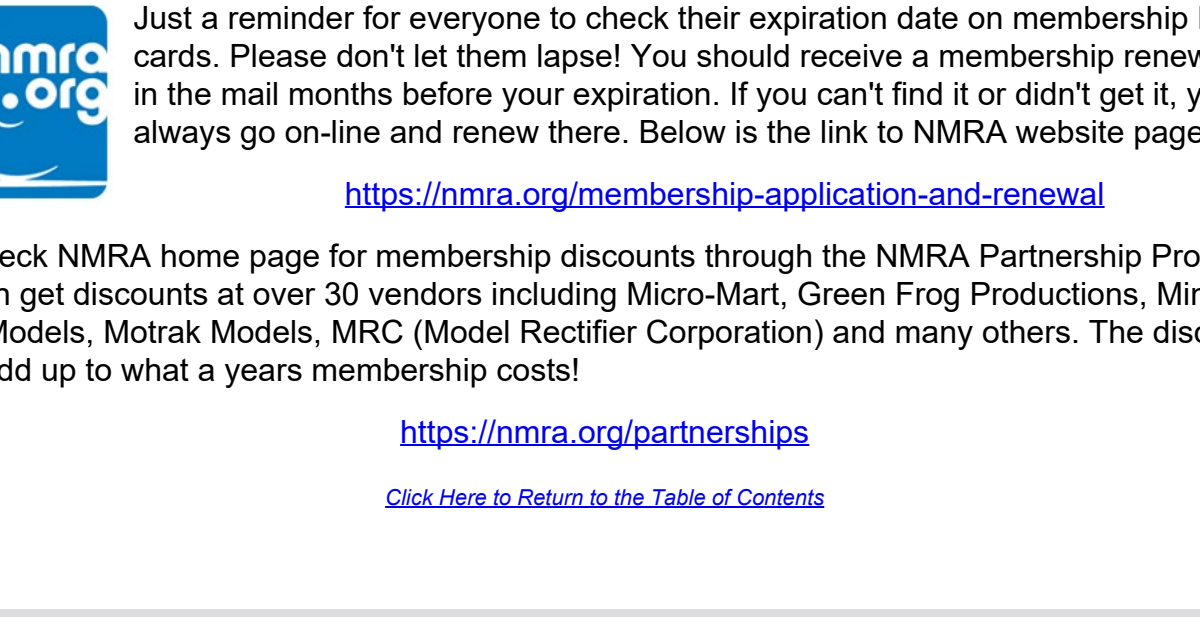
In January 2021 the 501(c)3 Golden Spike Train Club began leasing an 800-square-foot upstairs "storage" room from the Sugar Space Arts Warehouse at 132 South 800 West, Salt Lake City. But this is only temporary while they begin building a new H.O. FIXED-MODULAR model railroad layout. This room can't accommodate community open houses which they were doing monthly. But by end of 2022 they plan to move next door to a ground-floor 2,000 square foot climate-controlled room which can accommodate open houses and even some special-event train shows at the same Sugar Space Arts Warehouse. They then could welcome local NMRA events with other clubs and vendors on special weekends. But the rent on this new room will be about 4 times the current lease-agreement rent. So they are looking for new members (dues are \$20/month).

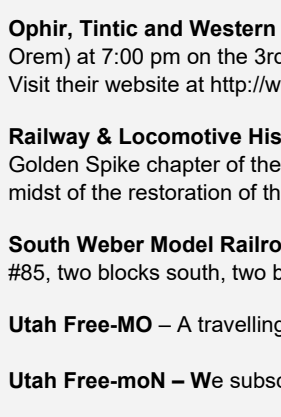
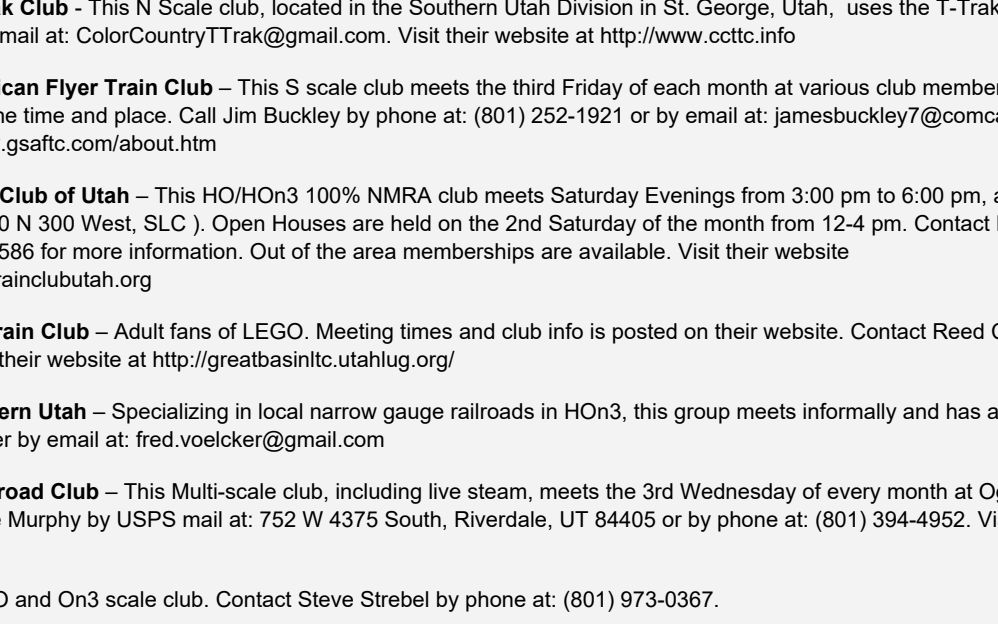
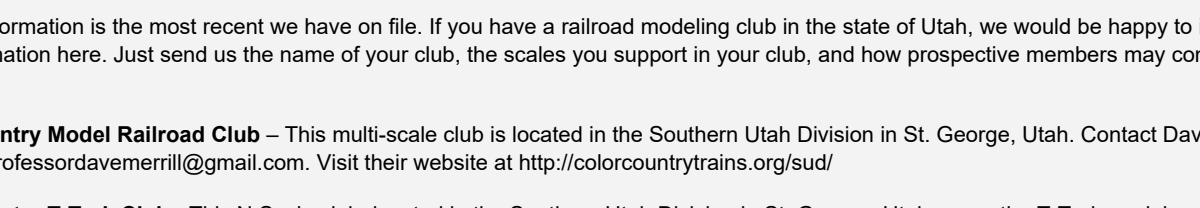

If you currently are, or recently have been, showing flu-like/covid like symptoms we ask that you please stay home, this is a social event.

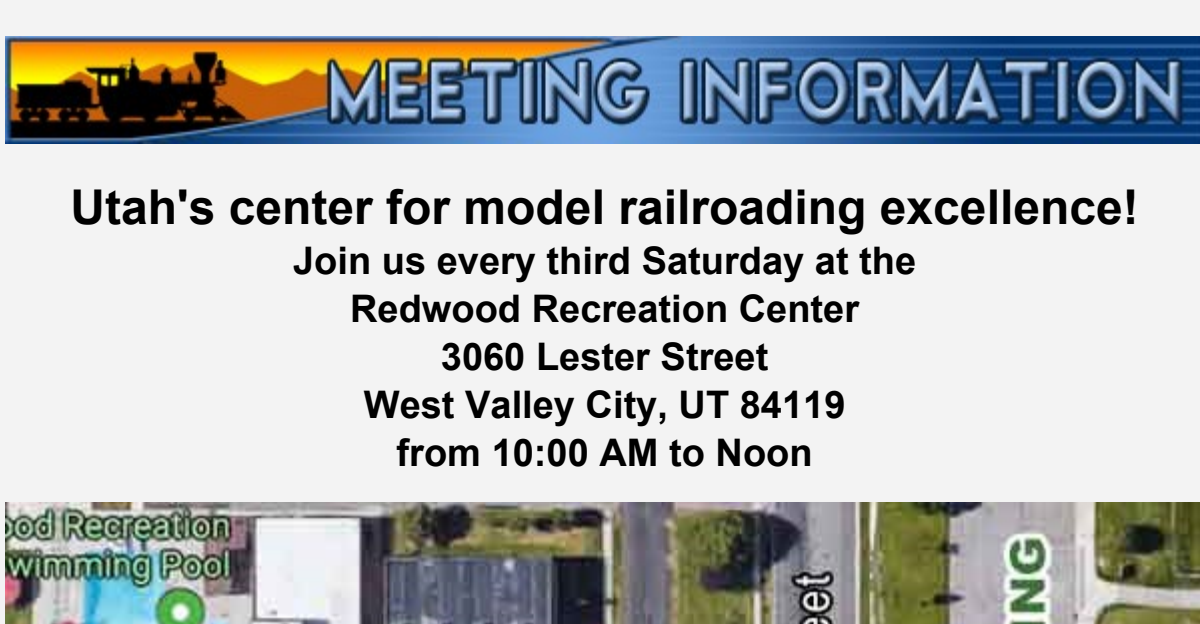
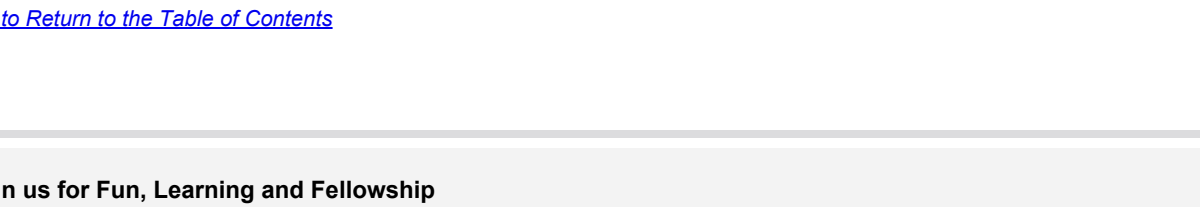
Due to eased Covid restrictions we are no longer using makeshift train cars. This means lines will be shorter and trains will be at full capacity! Masks are welcomed, but not required.

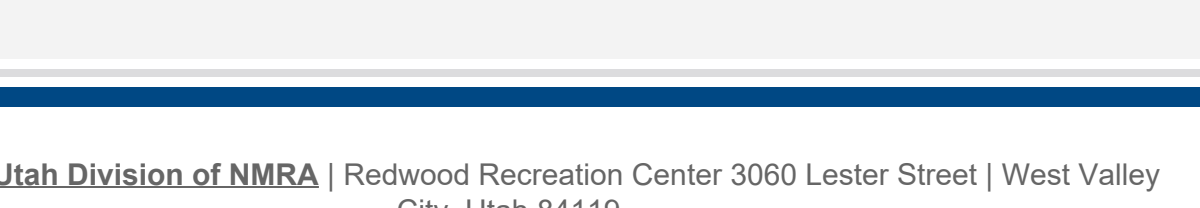
