So you want to do Operations?

Presented by Kevin Anderson MMR

Model railroad operations simulate real-world railroad purposes by moving freight and passengers according to a structured system instead of running trains in continuous loops. This aspect of the hobby transforms a static layout into a living transportation system. Operations can be used on any type of layout. From a small home layout to a large modular setup. Kevin walk us through the many different aspects of setting up your layout for operations. Such things as communications between operators, how trains are controlled, how specific cars are forwarded to their destination and many other aspects that need to be considered. The clinic even included a chance for participates to "play with trains!" A large simulated layout was setup in the other room and people had an opportunity to move wooden trains using a Track Warrant.

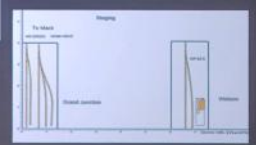
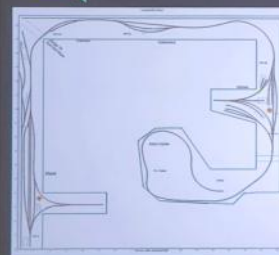

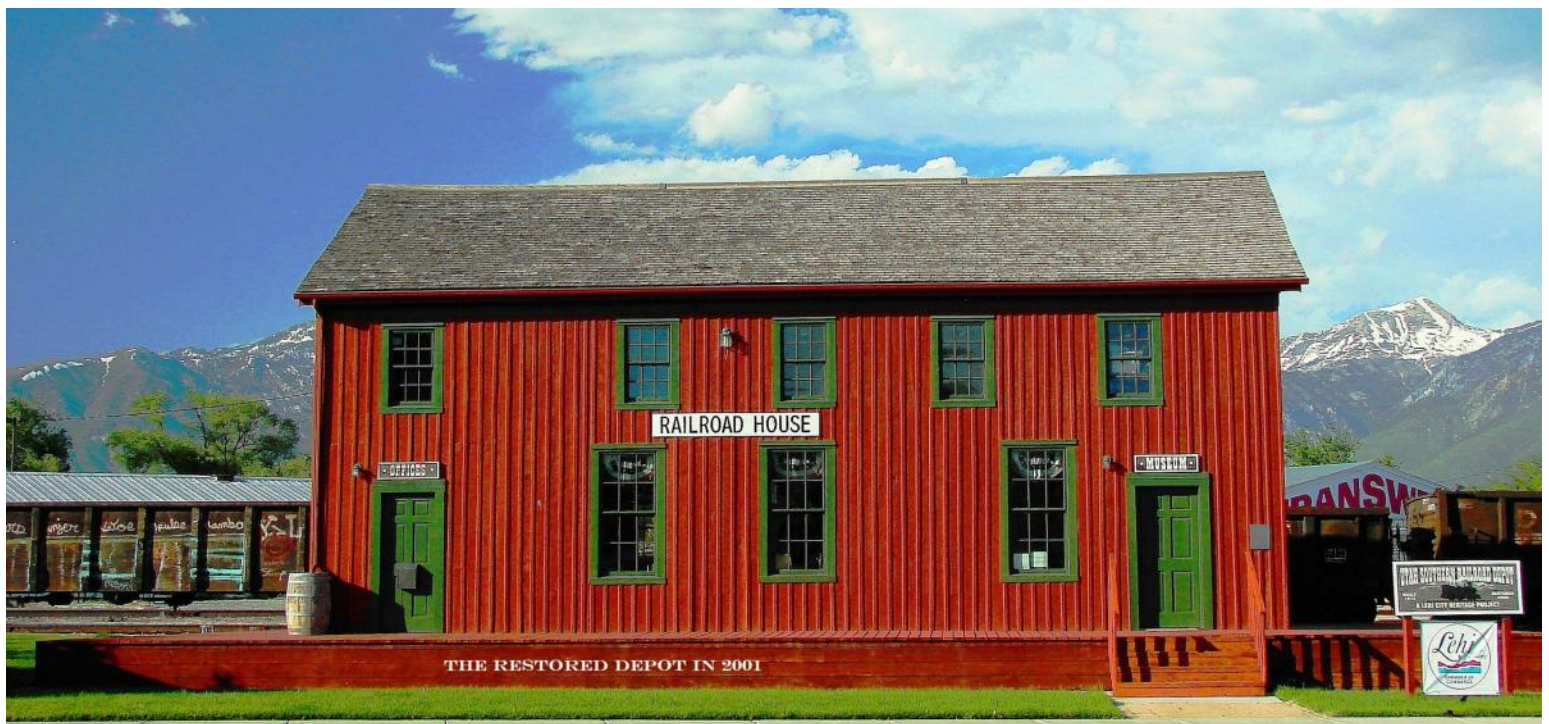

Achievement Program

Ray Persing, the National AP Chairman, posted this on Facebook on July 30th: On Monday, the NMRA Board approved the creation of the first new Achievement Program certificate in 40 years, for Master Builder Modular Railroading. It will be placed in the Settings category alongside Structures, Scenery, and Prototype Modeler. Many months of debate on the requirements and the language used in the final Statement of Qualifications were needed to hammer out this final version, and I greatly appreciate the time and effort put in by everybody to make this happen.



NMRA President Gordy Robinson said, "This new certificate recognizes integrated excellence. Rather than evaluating isolated components, it assesses a modeler's ability to combine trackwork, electrical systems, scenery, structures, and operations into a robust, standards-based portable system. Our hobby is at its best when our programs reflect how we actually build, operate, and share model railroading. By recognizing the specialized art of modular construction, we are celebrating a vital segment of our membership and setting a high standard for portable craftsmanship."



This is a really cool, and historic, addition to the Achievement Program. It recognizes a growing part of the hobby and gives an additional option for earning your Master Model Railroader. Now you can choose seven out of twelve certificates. Basically, if you are part of a modular group and have three modules (or module sets) you may have done enough to earn this certificate. Each module needs to earn a merit award which means scenery needs to be done. There is also a total square footage requirement.

The SOQ and Evaluation Form are online. You can go to nmra.org, click on Achievement Program under the Education drop down menu. Click on Categories on the menu on the right and it will be under Settings as another option, listed as Master Builder - Modular Railroading. I like how it combines several areas of model railroading into one certificate. Yes, you can "double dip" - the question was asked, "In general, what limitations are there if any on using the same models or pieces of layout for multiple categories of achievement? For example could one stretch of RR be used for say Prototype, Scenery, and Electrical? Thnx" Ray's answer to that, "Yes, they can. Typically they are being evaluated for different criteria depending on the category being considered."

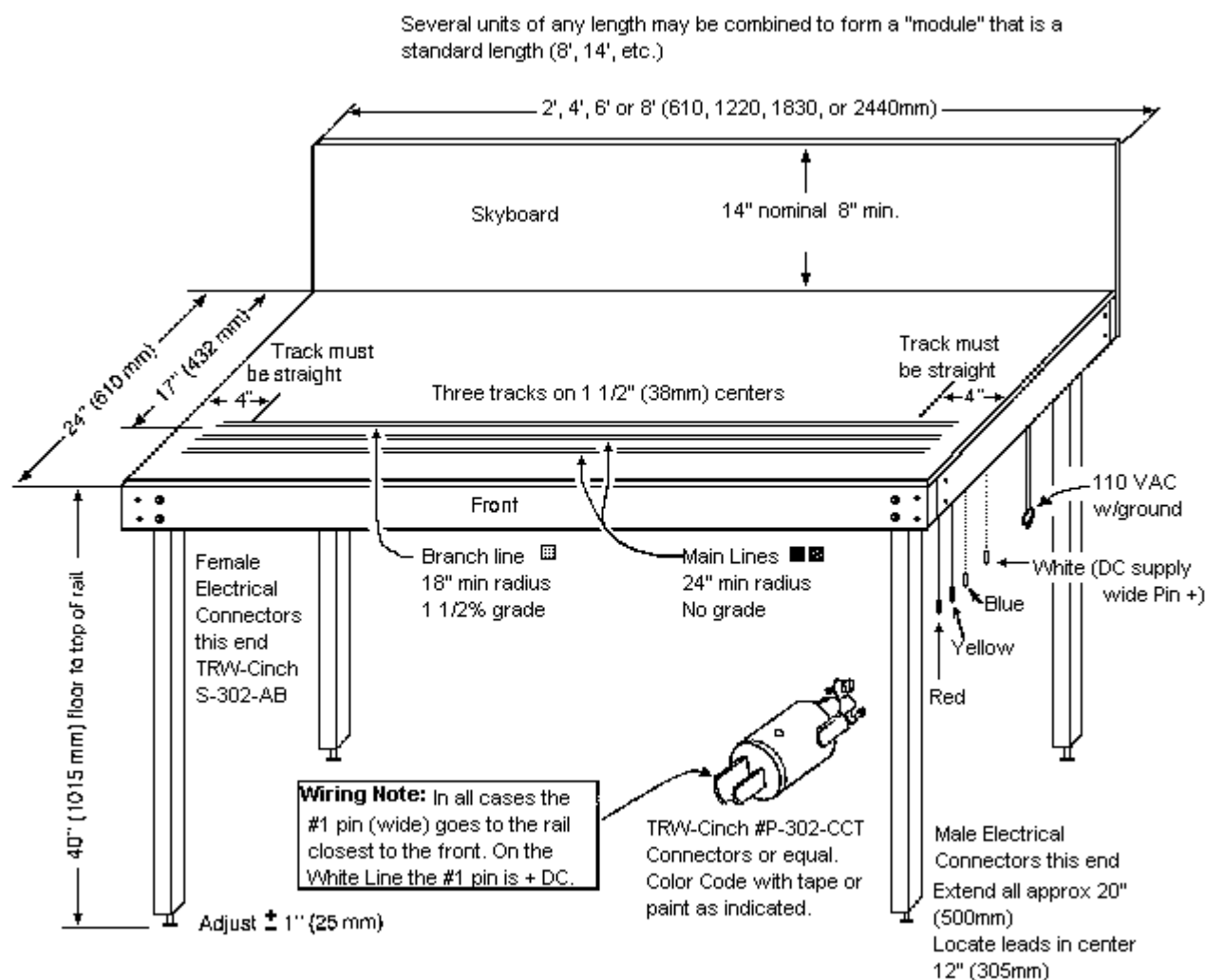
We will be going over the certificate requirements in more detail during the second half of the next Division meeting. In fact, there will be several modules that we plan on evaluating! One of the requirements is setting them up and running them at shows. That is definitely one way we can enjoy the journey together!
